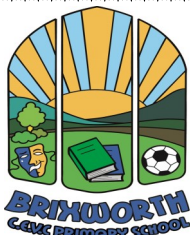

### Essential Information

#### Bikeability - Year 6

Bikeability starts on Monday 13th January for all participating pupils. Please ensure children have their helmets and have completed the bike check list, which was sent via ParentMail this week.

Pupils will need to take their bikes to Mr Salter in the activity area by the mobile classrooms before registration. No bikes can be left at school overnight.

We require up to date **phone numbers** where it can be ensured **we can contact you**, or somebody who can take full responsibility for your child, in the event of an **emergency**.

It is essential we are aware of all **medical conditions**, including **allergies**. Some lessons will involve food smelling and tasting. Teachers will use the information we hold on the child's records to establish if your child is able to participate in these sessions.

# Home Learning



At Brixworth we believe that daily practice of reading, spellings and times tables facts are the most important aspect that will have a positive impact on your child's education. Following feedback from the Autumn Term home learning we have made some changes. From now until the end of the Summer Term your child is expected to complete the following:

**Key Stage 1 children** - *equivalent to 10 minutes of home learning each day* which consists of reading, spelling/phonics and times tables/number bond practice.

**Year 3 and 4 children** – *equivalent to 20 minutes of home learning each day* that consists of reading, spellings and times tables practice.

**Year 5 and 6 children** - *equivalent to 30 minutes of home learning each day* that consists of reading, spellings and times tables practice.



## Rewards

Children will be rewarded for completing spelling and times table practice with Pupil Points.

## SPELLING



Spelling practice should be recorded in spelling books. Pupil points will be awarded for children who have scored 100%, increased on the previous week or who have tried really hard with that week's spellings.

Times tables practice is checked through teachers looking at each child's practice on Times Tables Rockstars. Pupil points will be awarded for regular weekly Practice and children's individual response times getting quicker.



For reading, each week children's Home School Message Books are collected in and raffle tickets are awarded to those children who have recorded an appropriate amount of reading for them. Each month in every year group a winner is drawn and the winning children each select a book that is bought by the school for the children to keep.



**Year 6 children** will be starting **SATs revision** on **Friday 24<sup>th</sup> January**, this will be explained at the SATs evening for parents on **Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> January**. Children will have the opportunity to attend a SATs revision club on Thursday lunchtimes to gain extra support or time to complete the set questions.

We ask for your engagement with these daily activities, to encourage your child and, where possible, share in these activities because daily practice of these core life skills will have a positive impact on your child's education.

## Experience Activities

Throughout the Autumn term we enjoyed sharing with children the experience activities they completed. We understand that some families are already completing activities like these, therefore this term the activity list will be **optional**. If your child wishes to complete all activities or just a couple this is you and your child's choice. If you do complete some of the activities we would love to share and look at these through your child's home learning book. We will also provide a second list of activities that cover more academic content for those children who want to complete more tasks through the weeks, again these activities are **optional**.

The above two sets of activities are to be recorded in children's Home Learning books and handed in on the following dates.

**Week beginning 27<sup>th</sup> January. Home Learning books handed in on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> January.**

**Week beginning 24<sup>th</sup> February. Home Learning books handed in on Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> February.**

**Week beginning 23<sup>rd</sup> March. Home Learning books handed in on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> March.**

**Home Learning books only need to be handed in on the Tuesdays mentioned above.**



# Parent Governor Vacancy

As sent out via ParentMail before Christmas we are looking to elect a new parent governor this term to join the Governing Board. Our parent governors are very valuable members of the governing board and we rely on them to help us to keep in touch with what parents are thinking.

Governing boards are responsible for a wide range of matters. Their duties include management of the school budget, school effectiveness, preparation for Ofsted inspection /formulation of post - Ofsted Action Plan and involvement in a variety of personnel and pupil issues. As a school governor, you will be supported in these duties by other experienced members of the governing board, headteacher, clerk to the governors and the County Council.

The Governing Board of Brixworth C.E.V.C. Primary School conducts a skills audit to inform the recruitment of new governors. The school is currently looking for a person with finance experience, a willingness to learn, attend meetings and be committed to school improvement are also very important qualities.

The Governing Board works together as a group, meeting twice a term. If you are thinking of standing as a governor, remember that you will need to attend six meetings a year, plus committee meetings and monitoring visits during the term. As a governor, you will hold office for a period of four years, even if your child leaves the school during this time. You can, however, resign from the governing board at any time. The governing board expects all new governors to attend training, complete DBS clearance and agree to the Governors' Code of Conduct.

Anyone who has parental responsibility for a pupil on the school roll at the time of the election can stand for election and can vote in the election. Nomination forms are available from the school Office along with the Disqualification Regulations. Please ensure you read these before deciding whether to put yourself forward for nomination.

If you wish you can include a few details about yourself and why you would like to become a governor and how you meet the following criteria:

- Evidence that demonstrates the skills and experience the governing board requires as stated above;
- Your commitment to undertake training and development to acquire or develop the skills to be an effective governor;
- If seeking re-election, details of your contribution to the work of the governing board during the previous term of office; and
- How you plan to contribute to the future work of the governing board.

In the event of an election, these details will then be circulated to all parents to help them decide who to vote for. You do not have to complete this section, but if you don't you may put yourself at a disadvantage if there is an election.

An election will be held via ParentMail if more nominations are received than the number of vacancies. If you are not registered on ParentMail we suggest you do this.

All nominations should be sent in to the school office by 3.30pm on Tuesday 14th January 2020. Every nomination must be signed.

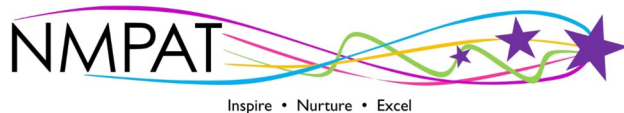
