Home School Values - Truthfulness

This term we are focusing on the Christian value of 'Truthfulness'. We introduced the value to the children during Collective Worship last week. We will be exploring the ideas of 'telling the whole truth', making right choices and having the courage to be honest and truthful even when it feels difficult to do so. We will also be encouraging the children to think about occasions when complete honesty could cause trouble or be hurtful and times when they might need to search for the truth.

A Home School Values sheet about Truthfulness was sent home via ParentMail on Wednesday. It contains lots of ideas, activities and challenges that you might like to share as a family. We would like to invite the children to complete the Home-School Challenge on the sheet. If they could ask a famous person (from history or alive today) a question about themselves, what would it be? They could make a colourful question mark and write their question on it, or simply write their question on a plain piece of paper. Their questions should then be posted in the Truthfulness Post Box, which is next to the worship table in the hall.



On Tuesday 17th January, we had a visit from a "time traveller" from the Anglo-Saxon times. She taught us about the weapons and armor that was used during battle. We were also taught about what men and women would do. Even how they went to the toilet!
