

Dear Parents and Carers,

For a number of years now the school has had a whole school vision linked to our Christian ethos. This is:

Be the Best You Can Be – academically, socially, emotionally, physically and spiritually within a safe, healthy, inspirational and enjoyable environment.

It is linked to the bible verse below, taken from Ephesians 2.10.



This vision for all our school family being the 'best they can be' is very important to us and something we want the children to really focus on. At the same time the school also had nine Christian Values that ran through each term and four additional values that we used in our celebration assemblies. These were 'Excellence, Aspiration, Inclusion and Respect.

Having thirteen different values that did not particularly link to the vision was a little confusing and not easy for the children to remember. Over the summer term we looked at
