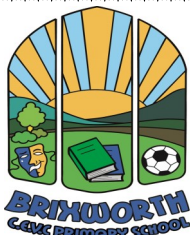

Celebration of Key Stage 2 Results

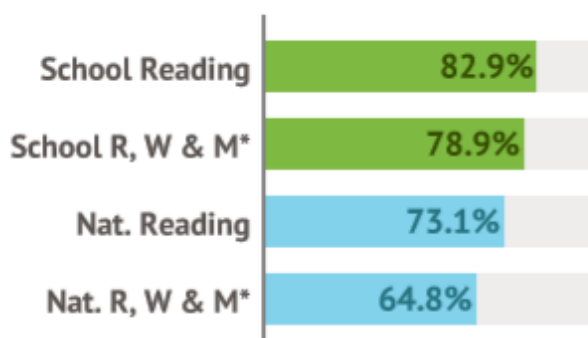

Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard: Reading

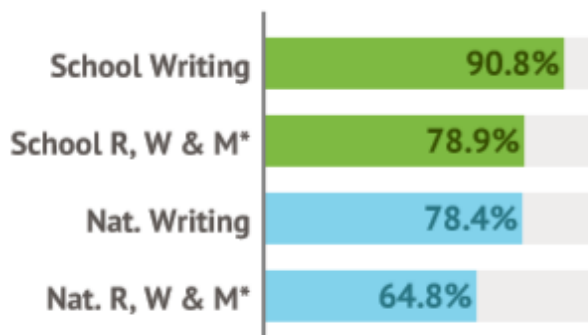

Pupils Working at the Expected Standard: Writing

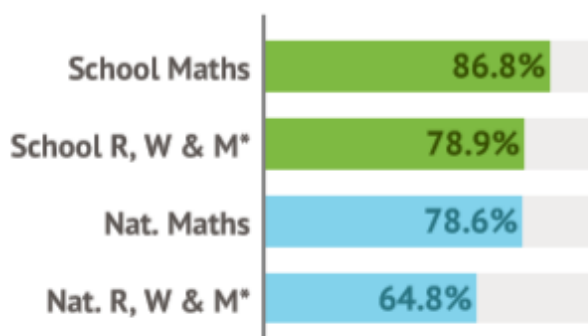

Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard: Maths

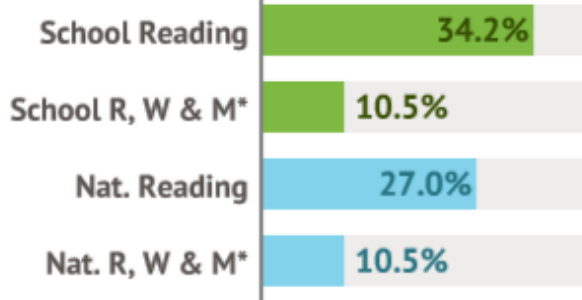

Pupils Achieving Higher Standard: Reading

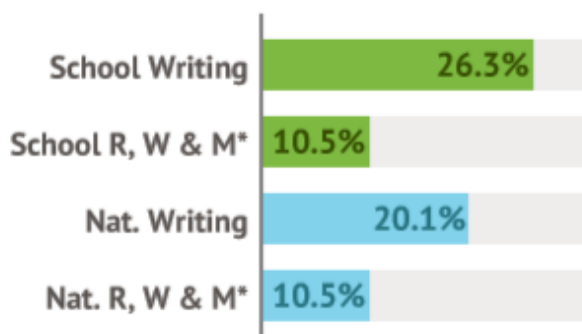

Pupils Working at Greater Depth: Writing

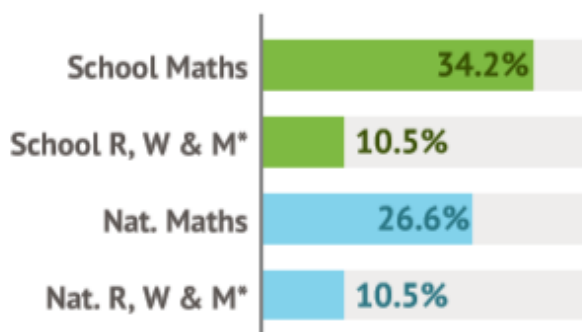

Year 6 children, supervised by members of staff, will then deliver the donations to the individuals concerned on **Friday 18th October**.

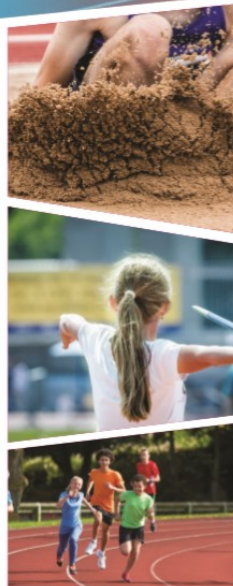
