Measles, Chicken pox and Shingles



We did three practice runs. There were 5 teams with 3 special guests, we were the 2nd special guest to appear in the competition.


When we performed Luke was nervous but overcame his fears of performing. Although we were nervous we were also excited and proud of ourselves.
