The End of the Academic Year

The perception is that schools are measured through a narrow set of criteria – primarily standards in the core subjects. Naturally, we also focus on academic achievement and it is gratifying that in this measure our end of Key Stage 2 pupils have achieved exceptionally highly this year. In maths 98% of the cohort gained Level 4+, 57% gained L5+ and almost one in five children achieved L6. In Reading 96% achieved L4+ and 57% L5+. For the first time in our school we have had pupils who have gained L6 in reading and writing.

However, academic achievement is only one aspect of our aspirations and excellence as a school. Our overarching focus remains our core values of Excellence, Inclusion, Aspiration and Respect within the setting of a Faith school. Life is a learning journey and our children’s experience at Brixworth is one chapter of this journey. As we say goodbye to our wonderful Year 6 pupils I reflect that our school gets many things right – but not everything. What I have come to appreciate is that when we do not get an element right we are forgiven because we can draw on a deep reservoir of goodwill from our parents.

I feel it is an immense privilege to be Head of the school. I work with an amazing team of colleagues from our site supervisor, to admin staff, to midday supervisors, to teaching assistants and teachers. In all these there is a consistent and constant dedication to the school and its children. I am supported (and challenged) by a Governing Body that is also committed to ensuring the best that can be provided for our pupils.

This week has involved saying farewell and thankyou to valued and long serving colleagues. However, with goodbyes we can say welcome to Miss Jen Davies, Miss Chelie Stockbridge and Mrs Flo Marlow (who will undertake her NQT year following her employment as an HLTA) – I hope all three will have a rewarding and successful start to their teaching career.

I wish our leavers every happiness in the future and for pupils who are returning a pleasant and enjoyable holiday.
