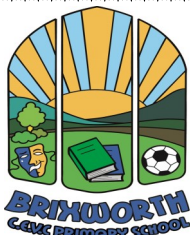

Brixworth Curriculum



At Brixworth Primary School we aim to provide our children with a broad and balanced curriculum which inspires and engages them in their learning whilst following the requirements of the National Curriculum.

Our children are taught the following subjects: English, Mathematics, Science, Computing, Art, Design, History, Geography, Music, French, Physical Education, Personal Social Health and Education (PSHE) and Religious Education. In order to achieve a balanced curriculum – i.e. to ensure that each subject area is given sufficient prominence and that the skills, concepts and knowledge in each subject are introduced and developed in a structured way – we base each term's work upon a long term plan.

The teaching of English and Maths is largely, though not wholly, during two daily lessons of approximately an hour's duration as well as a short daily reading skills lesson. The statutory Programmes of Study of the National Curriculum are taught but as with all of our teaching it is also led by the pupils' knowledge, needs and continuing teachers' assessments.



Subjects are taught in an integrated way wherever possible, using themes or topics to give a focus to learning. Where such an integration of subjects cannot be achieved, during a particular term, these discreet subjects are taught separately. Parents can find out about the topics for each term through the school website.
