Dear Parents

We are writing to you to tell you about our arrangements for supporting our children with their transition into their new classes for 2020-21.

As you know, we would normally give the children a chance to meet their new teacher and spend time in their new classes in the last couple of weeks of school. All children, whether or not they have had the opportunity to spend time in school this term, have experienced an extended period of disruption to their normal schooling and routines and we will be very mindful of this as they return to school next term.

At this moment in time the government has not given any indication of what arrangements might be in place for schools in the autumn term, other than to say that they are aiming for all children to be able to return. Discussions about possible scenarios are already happening within school and we will share more information with you about this as soon as we can.

As a school we believe that it is important to try to provide all our children with an opportunity to say goodbye to their current class and hello to their new class before the end of this school year. **In order to achieve this the school will not be open to pupils in foundation stage, year 1 or year 6 on Friday 10th July, Thursday 16th and Friday 17th July. It will however remain open for children of Key Workers.**

On Friday 10th July classes in year 2-5 will be invited to return to school and spend an hour on the field with their class teacher. If their teacher is not in school they will be invited to see their class in the main hall and their teacher through a video link. We will of course ensure that we continue to follow the current social distancing guidance provided for schools. This will be an opportunity for the children to see their class, their teacher and say goodbye. The children in Foundation Stage, year 1 and year 6 will have the opportunity to meet with their class and current teacher during the course of the week beginning 6th July.

Then on Thursday 16th July and Friday 17th July all children will be invited to meet their new class and new class teacher on the field for approximately an hour in school.

Our plan is that these events will take place on the school field unless it is extremely wet. If this was the case then we have an inside option and we would inform you nearer to the time about these plans.

More detailed information outlining specific times and arrangements will be provided nearer the time.



Traditionally we would be holding our sports days next week, however, in the current situation we are going to adapt the format and **all events will be for fun**. The events we have chosen mean children who are at home can take part and children are encouraged to let their teacher know their results.

The events for KS2 children are:

- Keepie up challenge- how many keepie ups can you do with a toilet roll?
- Shot Putt – How far can you throw a toilet roll using the shot putt technique?
- Standing Long Jump – from a standing start how far can you jump and land on 2 feet?
- Toilet Roll Race – how long does it take you to run 20m with a toilet roll between your legs?

The events for Foundation Stage and KS1 are:



Applying for free school meals

Should your circumstances have changed over the last few months you may be eligible for free school meals, even when your child is not in school.

Who's eligible?

Our school is providing free school meals for pupils who would usually receive benefits-related free school meals whilst in school. You're eligible for meals if your child is between 5 and 16 years old and if you receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income-based jobseeker's allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of pension credit
- Child tax credit (if you're not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working tax credit run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for working tax credit
- Universal credit - if you applied for it on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)


If you've started receiving any of these benefits since the coronavirus outbreak, you're eligible for this support.

Please note: we only receive funding for pupils who get food support because their parents receive any of the benefits listed above. If your child usually receives universal infant free school meals you will not be eligible.



Year 6 have been making Silhouette Art where they draw what makes them unique and what they like inside their silhouette. Also they made structures out of sticks for an outdoor challenge.


