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Dear Parents

I am sure that many of you are aware that the government produced guidance yesterday regarding the full opening of schools in September. We are still in the process of going through this guidance and working out the exact arrangements, however, I am delighted to say that we aim to be open for all pupils once again in September.

I would like to remind parents that the school will only be open for Key Worker children on Friday 10th July, along with children in Years 2-5 who are invited to meet up with their class teacher and class mates for the allocated hour on this day. We would really appreciate it if reading books could be returned and left in the box at the entrance gate which your child will be using.

The children in Foundation Stage and Year 1 will meet with their whole class and class teacher on Wednesday 8th July and Thursday 9th July respectively. Year 6 pupils will have the opportunity to see their teacher as part of their year 6 arrangements. Year 6 reports will be handed out on Thursday 9th July.

Due to the fact that things are so different this year, annual reports will be handed to the children at these transition meetings. The report will also include information about your child's next class teacher and a transition booklet which we would like the children to complete before meeting with the teacher on either Thursday 16th or Friday 17th July. If your child is not in school on the day that the reports are handed out then they will be posted out to you.

Next week, I will provide further guidance about the arrangements for Thursday 16th and Friday 17th July. As soon as we are able we will let you know our plans for September.


