rationing	A system during WW2 to limit the amount of food you were allowed to buy.
Blitz	Attacked by bombs dropped by enemy air force
evacuee	A person evacuated from a place of danger
conflict	A serious disagreement and argument about something important
allies	Formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose.
opponent	someone who competes with or opposes another in a contest, game, or argument.
Home Guard	A force organized often on a volunteer basis for local defense or home protection especially when the regular army is in a combat area .
Air raid	An attack in which bombs are dropped from aircraft on to a ground target.
Holocaust	The killing of millions of Jewish people by the Nazis.
invasion	When a foreign army invades a country by force.
Luftwaffe	The aerial warfare branch of the combined German Wehrmacht military forces during World War II.
RAF	The RAF is the air force of the United Kingdom. RAF is an abbreviation for 'Royal Air Force'.

## Timeline of events

Sep 1939	Germany invade Poland. Britain and France declare war.
Jan 1940	Rationing is introduced.
May 1940	Churchill takes over Chamberlain as Prime Minister.
June 1940	Children are evacuated from main
June 1940	Italy enters the war and declares war on Britain and France.
Aug 1940	Germany tries to destroy the RAF in The Battle of Britain.
Sep 1940	The Blitz
June 1941	Clothes rationing is introduced.
Dec 1941	Japan bombs US Naval base at Pearl Harbour. USA joins the war.
June 1944	D-Day
7th May 1945	Germany surrenders.
8th May 1945	VE day
